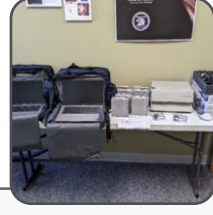


RAM Telehealth

Synchronous Clinical Experiences in N383- *Population Health & Global Perspectives for the RN*

Students Given Choice Between Two Options:



- Onsite at Community Partner
- i. RAM Clinic in Knoxville



- Attend Two Simulated Zoom Patient Encounters
- i. Standardized Patients Portrayed Cases
 - ii. Two Unfolding Scenarios in each session
 - iii. Based on RAM SOAP notes and client population
 - iv. Faculty debriefings immediately following patient encounters

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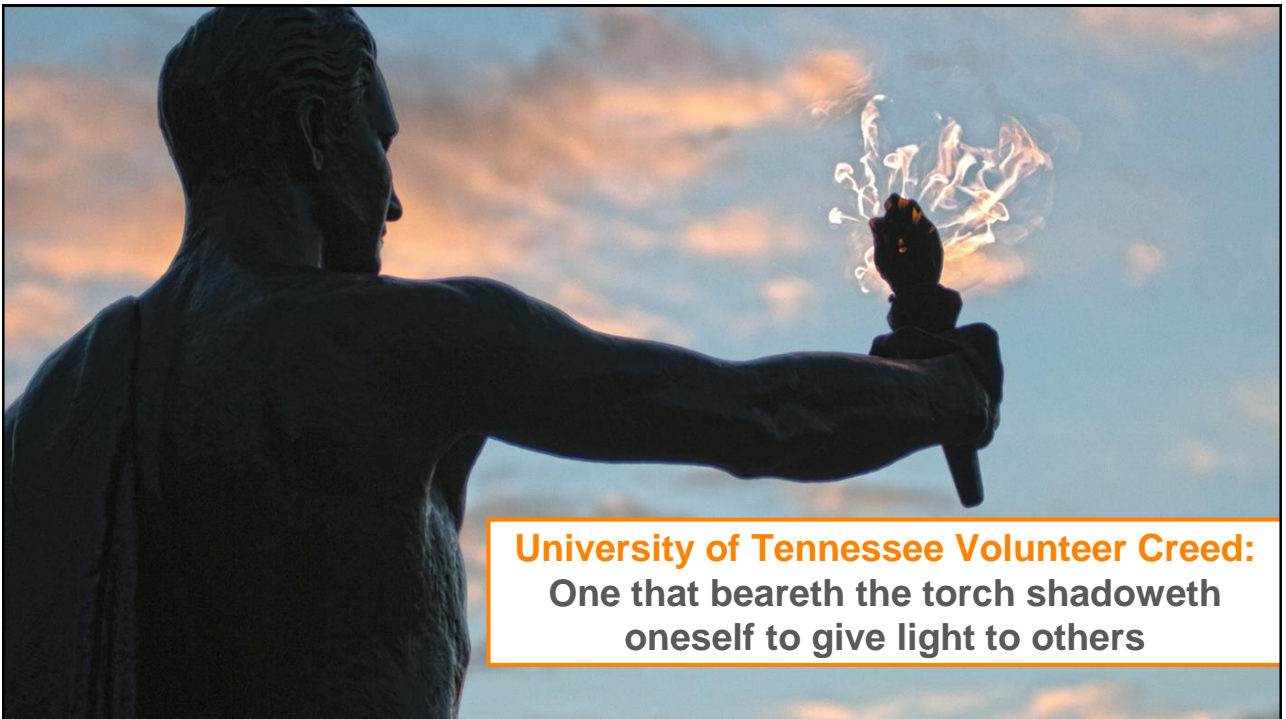
