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“Pandemic Disruption: A Call for Innovation^a”

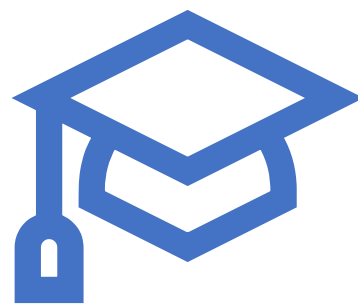
- Challenges in preparation for nursing practice pre-pandemic
- Inflexible curriculum and teaching strategies
- “Hurried and impromptu” online learning during the pandemic, “without time for modification of teaching methodologies to reflect best practices for the virtual classroom.”
- Issue with “digi[t]izing” past modalities” instead of building online courses from the ground up.

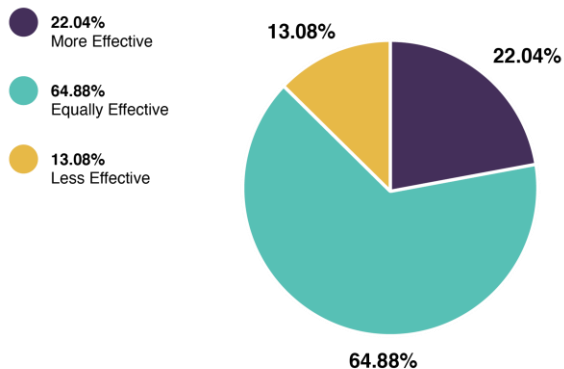

Conclusions & Implications for Practice

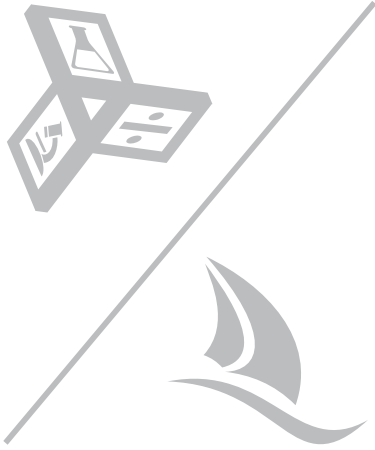
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Conclusions
